Well-know Belgian artist to open art school in Namibia

ell-known Belgian artist, Juan Kiti, is planning to open an art school on the Epacha Game Reserve, adjacent to Etosha National Park. Together with the chairman of Leading Lodges of Namibia, Count Paul van de Vijver, the duo are planning to submit a proposal to the European Union (EU) to assist in building the school.


According to Olivier van de Vijver, Leading Lodges of Namibia Marketing Manager and son of Count Paul, the school will benefit Namibian artists greatly. It will compose a mixture of twenty upcoming and professional artists. He says that students who are admitted to the school will be awarded full scholarships which includes free lodging and tuition and they will be selected purely on talent.

Olivier revealed that the school will train students in painting, sculpture and jewelery design and they will be awarded certificates on completion.

"The idea is to make the artists selfsustainable," he said, adding that Kiti
will invite galleries worldwide to come
and see the students' work which will
create opportunities to sell their work
internationally.

Kiti visited Namibia last week on invitation of the hospitality group, Leading Lodges of Africa. The artist was so inspired by the Namibian landscapes and scenes, that he completed two paintings whilst in the country. The one painting was done of Dead Vlei in the Sossusvlei area, and the second painting in the bushveld at Epacha Game Lodge and Spa. Kiti was accompanied by a film crew and a number of journalists, who filmed and recorded the artist at work.

During his visit to Namibia, Kiti also met Esther Kauluma, the daughter of King Immanuel Kauluma Eliphas where he donated one of his paintings to King Kauluma Children's Trust, which is currently constructing an orphanage in Ondangwa.
